- Eligible projects: permanent housing (including permanent supportive housing), supportive service only (coordinated entry, street outreach, standalone SSO), HMIS, CoC planning, UFA costs
- Cannot solicit projects for emergency shelter
- HUD scoring priorities want to fund projects that are new and not necessarily just expansions of traditional homeless services
- Scoring criteria on a 100 point scale;
   applications must receive 50 points to be
   considered, and HUD will fund 10 per state;
   communities with larger unsheltered
   populations are eligible for up to 30 bonus
   points, and the YWH CoC is not eligible for these
- Montgomery County Priorities for the special NOFO: Address racial and other disparities, improve coordination between law enforcement and homeless services, improve coordination between behavioral health and homeless services, help people exit from street homelessness directly to permanent housing
- We will publish the scorecard for the NOFO with the application
